Subject: Stopping Global Corruption

- 1. Alarmed by an increase in global corruption around the world, in various nations,
- 2. Recognizing the severe effects corruption has on our nations and our people,
- 3. Reaffirming that stopping global corruption is the single most important factor in ensuring good governing,
- 4. Emphasizing the need to end corruption in order to better serve the people of this world,
- 5. Taking into account the billions of people who have already been affected by corruption over the years,
- 6. Bearing in mind the inaction of various governments to combat the issue of corruption,
- 7. Guided by an urge to help those who have been affected and those who are currently being affected,
- 8. Desiring a progressive, peaceful, and prosperous future for all nations,
- 9. Seeking justice for people who have been targeted by corrupt officials,
- 10. Recalling that it is the mission of the United Nations to stop these corrupt activities around the world,
- 11. Stressing once again the importance of removing corrupt officials from office,
- 12. Calls upon the General Assembly and member states to create and enforce the following:
 - a. Laws and regulations, if not already done so, to find and prosecute corrupt officials,
 - b. Strengthen and stricten existing laws so that all corruption is removed,
 - c. Establish policies to monitor government officials in order to find corruption at its root,
 - d. Have a system of checks and balances so that no one official can abuse his or her power,

- e. Set up a department or a section of a department dedicated to finding and exposing corrupt officials and the corrupt acts they have done,
- f. Establish a department of a section of a department that compensates and assists those who have been affected by corruption,
- g. Give freedom to the public and the press to investigate such matters, and to take action on their part,
- h. Create a transparent government in which citizens can at any given time gain information as to what the government is working on and how they are doing their work,
- i. Enforce security in public elections so that the people's voices are heard and corrupt officials are removed from office by the people themselves, and
- j. Provide aid and support to those nations that are still heavily dealing with issues of corruption, or those nations that simply do not have the resources or wealth to tackle the issue.
