Topic: Humanitarian/Foreign Issues of DPRK

Recognizing that humanitarian rights are being violated in other parts of the world,

Shocked that self-proclaimed leaders of the world such as but not limited to America and their activities with separating migrant children from their parents,

Angered that nations who declare themselves as leaders of the world engage in hypocritical policies while telling other nations such as North Korea to fix their alleged humanitarian issues,

Proclaiming the absurdity of the United States of America, who wishes to stop the growth of nuclear arsenal and the essential basic protection via weapons to the peaceful and well-established nations of the world,

Saddened at the fact that the United States of America along with other western powers would advocate for intense sanctions against North Korea which currently installed starvation and socioeconomic issues which henceforth harms the well-established nation of North Korea as stated by the BBC News, "Two in Five North Koreans are undernourished...18 million people across DPRK continue to suffer from food insecurity,"

Due to these factors that is proclaimed above, the following is proposed,

- 1) Officially condemns the United States of America for their devilish and hypocritical policies, and their lack of empathy for the North Korean people as they push for sanctions as according to several UN resolutions 2375, and 2270;
- 2) Establishes the North Korean Delegation of United States Affairs to oversee any executive or legislative/diplomatic in relations to North Korea to ensure that North Korea is treated fairly in the eyes of the Western world;
- 3) Allows for three United States diplomats to stay and oversee the nation's affairs as an oversight committee in efforts to promote USA and DPRK relations;
- 4) In order to promote diplomatic relations, assuming that the following nations consent, trade will be allowed with Lithuania and Latvia, and Britain;
- 5) Allows for foreign and humanitarian aid via the Red Crescent and other support given by the UN;
- 6) In exchange for foreign/humanitarian aid and the re-opening of trade with the nations and organizations mentioned above, the DPRK will decrease the nuclear arsenal pile by 15%.

Hoping that the DPRK will be able to communicate diplomatically with all nations of the questionable UN.
