Topic: Deployment of United Nation Coalition Forces in the Middle East

The General Assembly,

Recalling the destabilizing effect of ISIS on the Middle East,

<u>Aware of</u> the continued fights to defeat terrorism and continued support of local troops and governments provided by the United States and several United Nations member states, and the United Nation Security Forces,

<u>Expressing its appreciation</u> with the 41 nations who committed troops to the assault against insurgent forces in Iraq and the 14 contributing nations in the Syrian Civil War

<u>Viewing with appreciation</u> the continued efforts of United States troops in destabilized regions such as Syria in combating threats of a terroristic nature,

<u>Having examined</u> the complex issues of sovereignty and government of recovering governmental structures in the region,

<u>Deeply concerned</u> with recent moves to recall troops by the United States from Syria, <u>Guided by</u> a hope for a better tomorrow and a stable Middle East,

- Encourages the continued support of recovering nations such as Syria through military or economic needs;
- 2. <u>Calls upon</u> the use of United Nations Security Forces to assist in maintaining peace and stability with the recession of militant groups such as ISIS;
- 3. Authorizes the creation of the Middle-Eastern Entrenchment Task-force (MEET);
- 4. This taskforce will
 - a. Be a combination of United Nation Security Forces and voluntary contributions from United Nations member nations to maintain security in destabilized regions;

- i. This combination will contain 3,000 United Nations Security Forces;
 - This includes a personnel for the deployment of 125 armored personnel carriers (APC's), 300 trucks for use in supply or deployment circumstances, 75 tanks for combat support of infantry, 5 multi-role fighter aircraft, and 3 ground-attack aircraft;
- ii. An optimal 2,000 additional troops would be garnered from voluntary troops allocations from United Nations member nations;
- b. Work with local forces to train and combat threats;
- c. Continue the work done by the United States and coalition forces to prevent the re-emergence of insurgent groups;
- 5. <u>Condemns</u> the continued assaults on civilian targets and member nations carried out by insurgent groups;
- 6. <u>Endorses</u> the continued support of action in the Middle East to help stabilize the region.
