<u>Cognizant of</u> modern slavery, more commonly known as human trafficking, as a global epidemic,

Deeply perturbed by the prevalence of the crime,

Calling attention to forty million documented victims,

<u>Having studied</u> the Declaration of Human Rights by the United Nations, Article Four, which prohibits the grievous practice of modern slavery,

- 1. <u>Reaffirms</u> the importance of evaluating and creating stricter child protection laws to safeguard the most vulnerable citizens of society from unlawful labor practices;
- 2. <u>Strongly urges</u> all organizations relevant to the United Nations to implement mandated training in primary schools, educating students on the dangers of human trafficking;
- 3. <u>Requests</u> that each country enacts stricter border security laws, in relation to
 - a. Thoroughly and respectfully questioning individuals and children traveling between countries;
- 4. <u>Calls for</u> a specialized task force to be established as an international organization in order to combat modern slavery, which will
 - a. Investigate cases related to human trafficking;
 - b. Submit disputes to the International Court of Justice (ICJ);
 - c. Have the authority to detain clear violators of human rights in the context of forced labor;
- 5. <u>Encourages</u> the implementation of resources to be provided for survivors of human trafficking, including
 - a. Food, shelter, water, and clothing;
 - b. Counseling and mental health services.
