The General Assembly,

<u>Noting</u> that the UN, EU, U.S, South Korea, Japan, and other allies all have stringent and excessive sanctions on trade that are, in fact, crippling,

<u>Keeping in mind</u> that citizens in the DPRK are affected by the sanctions and the economic crisis caused by such sanctions,

<u>Noting further</u> that Pyongyang has become increasingly isolated from global trade, and that Korean citizens are being cut off from economic opportunities,

<u>Further Deploring</u> that sanctions placed on major exports of Pyongyang is severely affecting the GDP of the DPRK,

<u>Noting with zest</u> that international negotiations can, and will, help to not only solve the economic crisis forced upon the DPRK, but benefit other countries as well,

- 1. <u>Condemns</u> the United Nations for placing crippling trade sanctions on North Korea;
- <u>Condemns</u> the European Union for placing crippling trade sanctions on the DPRK, banning the export of certain goods to North Korea;
- <u>Condemns</u> the United States for placing strangling trade restrictions on North Korea, as well as trying to suppress North Korean companies, as well as placing sanctions on and fining companies for conducting trade with the DPRK;
- 4. <u>Condemns</u> South Korea, Japan, and assorted other U.S. allies for placing further sanctions on the DPRK;
- 5. <u>Calls for</u> the removal of sanctions on exports from the DPRK;
 - a. This is to help the economy of the DPRK, which is currently being severely stifled due to the sanctions that a multitude of nations have forced upon it;
- 6. <u>Requests</u> that negotiations to lessen the severity of the sanctions on the DPRK restart.
