Topic: The Palestine Question

Special Political Committee,

<u>Guided by</u> the purpose of maintaining global peace and international safety as set forth in the Charter of the United Nations,

Bearing in mind that in order to achieve the goals of the United Nations, peaceful means of mediation and problem solving are expected and preferred,

Reaffirming the right of sovereign states to peacefully settle disputes either amongst themselves or in the forums set up in the Charter of the United Nations,

<u>Fully aware</u> that it is sometimes necessary to apply forceful measures in order to achieve the goals of the United Nations,

<u>Convinced</u> that these forceful measures should only be enacted in extreme circumstances and only as a last resort,

<u>Desiring</u> a solution to the long-term Israeli-Palestinian conflict, through peaceful means of negotiation and regulation,

<u>Taking into account</u> the severity of the situation as it consists of religious, cultural and political areas of dispute,

- 1. <u>Calls for</u> the formation of a coalition between Palestinian National Authority, Jordan, Egypt, and the Gulf Cooperation Council (PJEG) with the purpose of establishing an agreement between the partners;
- 2. <u>Endorses</u> the goal of a successful two-state solution where all parties are in agreement, while realizing that this solution is not realistic in the near future;
- 3. <u>Requests</u> the creation of a council between the PJEG coalition and Israel for the purpose of negotiating all aspects of of agreement and the final solution;
- 4. <u>Encourages</u> the presence of the U.N. at the council for the purpose of maintaining order, peace and regulation;

- 5. <u>Designates</u> a negotiation over the Gaza Strip with the outcome favoring the restoration of the Palestinian National Authorities control over the Gaza Strip with GCC military forces deployed in the strip along with the Palestinian National Authorities;
- 6. Strongly affirms the removal of all rockets and the cease of fire, as well as halting the tunnel digging;
- 7. Supports the merging of the Hamas' military forces and the Palestinian National Authorities;
- 8. Further requests the creation of a port in the Gaza Strip and the Rafah crossing to be opened.
