## The Ad Hoc Political and Security Committee.

Expecting to withhold order internationally, and personal security to all countries as previously attributed in Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations,

Aware that the goals of the United Nations may only be fulfilled with assertive procedures and direct action,

Recalling articles three, and five of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), which state the inalienable rights to personal safety, and the underlying freedoms that all human beings are authorized to,

Taking into consideration the Action for Peacekeeping Initiative (A4P), issued in 2019 in order to continue with joint political obligation to peacekeeping processes,

<u>Deeply Concerned</u> on the recent outbursts of violence associated with drugs in Mexico,

Emphasizing Mexico's consistent issues regarding physical and gun violence, the country in the past year coming to its greatest known homicide rate, with more than 27 deaths per 100,000 people,

- 1. <u>Recommends</u> expanding law enforcement, and public security officers in struggling countries, including Mexico;
- 2. <u>Considers</u> increasing training among police officials in order to gain trust between law enforcement officials, and the general public;
- 3. <u>Supports</u> broadening employment opportunities to those in need, leading more people to better paths of life;

- 4. Accepts the investigation of smart gun technology, and the benefits that go along with its use;
- 5. <u>Further Requests</u> the use of surveys and statistics related to victimization and global crime;
- 6. <u>Draws the attention</u> to an increase in utilization of DNA evidence, so that the identification and arresting of suspects becomes easier.
