Topic: The Hong Kong-China Conflict

Recognizing that the Hong Kong-China conflict is not just an internal issue;

Observing that all nations are entitled to decide their own government system;

<u>Aware of the proposed Fugitive Offenders and Mutual Legal Assistance in Criminal Matters</u>
Legislation (Amendment) Bill 2019 that outlined an extradition policy that violated the
Sino-British Joint Declaration;

<u>Reminding</u> all nations of the Sino-British Joint Declaration that ensured the principle of one country two systems until 2047;

<u>Alarmed by</u> the violations of human rights in Hong Kong following Mainland China's proposed extradition bill;

<u>Deeply Concerned</u> with the arrest and detainment of visitors in Hong Kong during the protests; <u>Recalling</u> that the *Universal Declaration of Human Rights* outlines the rights of freedom of expression and freedom to peacefully assemble, which are the primary human rights being violated;

- 1.) <u>Condemns</u> the violent measures taken by China to suppress the right of Hong Kong citizens to assemble;
- 2.) <u>Authorizes</u> the detention and arrest of Hong Kong visitors due to their relation to the protests be prohibited;
- 3.) <u>Reminds</u> all member nations that Hong Kong is not recognized as their own political entity by the United Nations, and is therefore, unable to voice their opinion;
- 4.) <u>Calls upon</u> all nations to institute an embargo on China and Hong Kong in regards to the trade of weapons;
- 5.) <u>Emphasizes</u> the need for harsher laws on China that promote transparency when it comes to involvement with Hong Kong's government;
- 6.) <u>Urges</u> an outlined procedure to resolve any future international or domestic conflict.

- 7.) <u>Supports</u> granting Hong Kong activist that are actively being pursued by China's government political asylum;
- 8.) <u>Requests</u> that all democratic member nations to support the Hong Kong Human Rights and Democracy Act;
- 9.) <u>Further requests</u> that all democratic nations support Hong Kong, should they choose to pursue efforts towards self-determination.
