





**Did you know?** In 1898, our building was one of the first designed by the architectural firm of Esenwein & Johnson. They went on to design some of Buffalo's most iconic buildings, including: The Calumet

## Crosby Company, manufacturers of Gold Medal Flour. The first non-residential occupant was the Temple of Unity and Truth, which occupied the site from 1941-1942. The Buffalo Association for the Blind (now Olmsted Center for Sight) called the building its headquarters from 1947-1973. In 1973, the
