

Our Housing Case Manager and Specialized Employment Counselor, funded by the Department of Justice, serve all youth, adult, foreign national, and U.S. citizen survivors of human trafficking who are clients of IIB and need housing

The Housing Case Manager seeks out housing options that enrolled survivors identify as safe and non-triggering. They then work with landlords to pay security deposits and initial rent payments on leases executed in survivors' names.
